WHAT IT IS... HOW IT WORKS...

1000 FLOWERS is a wholesale punk rock record distribution service. That's the story, as simple as I can make it. You have a shop, lots of little guys make records. You can sell some copies of this and some copies of that, but maybe not enough to go straight to each of dozens and dozens of resources cost effectively. So you deal with Mordam, and that's cool, and you may go straight to a few of the bigger indie labels, and that's cool. You pick up some of the hotter punk CDs from your favorite One Stop, paying too much in the process. The End. That's how the biz is done.

Unfortunately, a lot of really cool stuff doesn't get stocked. Stuff you can sell. Particularly unfortunate is the awful supply situation for vinyl 7"ers, which, if you haven't discovered it yet, are enjoying a major comeback in popularity with The Kids. So you miss sales. Your store isn't as "cool" as it might be, so some kids get into ordering stuff direct, cutting you out altogether. Some labels don't get their piggies to market at all, so they choke and die.

This situation sucks for everyone but the post office. 1000 Flowers is not an exercise in making lots of money. If I avoid losing my butt, I will be satisfied. This project is inspired by the success story that is Mordam Records—a marketing umbrella that delivers merchandise to you inexpensively and efficiently, in the process providing an outstanding degree of distributive support for member labels. Label participants in the 1000 Flowers syndicate are asked to keep their cost prices to an absolute minimum. In turn, the add-on for operational costs like this catalog is kept to an absolute minimum. The labels will be treated with respect and paid regularly and in full. Retailers will receive fast service.

Other items have been purchased up front from nonmember labels. I've cherry picked these like hell, with an eye to stuff with a Pacific Northwest interest. I can put 'em in your store cheaper than Joe Onestop and much cheaper than Horrible Corporate Distributors plus I'm a lot, well, sweller than Those Other Guys. I'll even buy ya a beer next time you're in town.

When's the last time Warner Bros. did that for ya?

Here's the fine print, and don't you love it... Blah, blah, blah, blah, blah...

- 1. Everything must be either prepaid or shipped COD. As soon as it leaves my hands, I'll owe the labels for the stuff I send you. And on payday, those labels are gonna get paid, god damn it. So we're not gonna get into accounts receivable, unpaid bills, bad checks, and all that disgusting crap.
- 2. You can pay for your CODs with a company check. **Do not under any circumstances bounce** a **check!** There will be a \$20 fee for all returned checks, plus you stand a strong chance of earning my ongoing enmity. Don't do it, period, The End!
- 3. You may order by phone (leave a message on the machine), by fax (probably the best method), or by mail.
- 4. Your order will be shipped via UPS, generally within 48 hours. Freight costs will, of course, be added to your bill.
- 5. All orders will be handled as "Ship & Cancel." I will not back-order temporarily out of stock material unless you specifically request that I do so.
- 6. This catalog is intended to be supplemental to the Mordam Records catalog. If it's in Mordam, it won't be here. **Patronize Mordam whenever possible!**

If you're still getting your titles on Lookout!, AmRep, Dr. Strange, Alternative Tentacles, Kill Rock Stars, Shredder, Broken Rekids, Allied, Estrus, and Sympathy (among others) from anyone BUT Mordam, you clearly need to get in touch with 'em and save yourself a couple bucks. I'm not affiliated with them, just a cheerleader, and I wanna see corporate distributors cut out of the equation, the records cheaper, and your bottom line blacker.






FIENDZ Everybody's Favorite 7"







File this one under GARAGE. Both tracks jump right along and feature slightly distorted vocals. A good, loud band that'll keep the neighbors up all night, guaranteed.



'68 COMEBACK Do The Rub 7"
Jeffrey Evans and '68 COMEBACK do contrified guitar stuff. The B-side on this one is way the hell over my head, artsy spoken word over some distorted, tuneless guitar riffing. Label says it's a cover from 1972. Weird.

There are no K Records CDs listed here. Why? They are exclusive to Warner Bros./ADA. That means you're gonna be paying too much for them and the kids are gonna be paying too much for them at retail. Uncle Warner buys for six and sells for ten, something like that. He does it in massive quantities. A label gets to a certain stage and then they've really got very few options, unless they're a part of Mordam. The hogs end up getting a big chunk of the indie action. That really sucks.

New label announcement

Since I won't be doing direct sales to stores outside of 1000 Flowers, I thought it necessary to take a bit of space here to announce the creation of my new punk rock label and share some of its premises and concepts. Sounds boring, huh?

MUTANT POP will have a definite "sound," basically the same sort of "East Bay Sound" pop-punk made famous by Lookout! Records, Shredder, and others. I won't be producing hardcore nor will I be doing pop that doesn't rock hard enough to be called "punk."

Mutant Pop is gonna be collector-oriented in the same way as was early Sub-Pop. If you're doing a label in a small town, you either do that or go broke and I'm into this seriously and for the long haul. First pressings will always be on colored vinyl in limited editions. There will be no slimey "special edition" clubs, you the retailers will be carrying the ball and running with it. Sleeves will have a set "look," production will always be first-rate, packages will be of quality, and the kids are gonna end up collecting 'em like base-ball cards...

The label is going to be run honestly and according to punk ethics. Working model will be the one first developed by Lookout! Records—60% of net proceeds to bands if a project runs in the black, with honest accounting at all times.

Distribution will be non-exclusive but tightly controlled. Rhetoric Records, P.O. Box 82, Madison, WI 53701 will be handling the series, as will probably three or four other honest and committed punk-oriented distributors. I'm looking for partners on that front in California and on the East Coast and will pass that information along as soon as it becomes available. The records and CDs will never be available through Warner ADA, Sony Relativity, EMI Caroline, or Dutch East India.

I thank you in advance for your support of the label and look forward to building a long, happy, and mutually profitable business relationship with you, my retail partners.
