We'll cut to the chase... The 13th Mutant Pop Records compact disc is on the street. EGGHEAD. Dumb Songs for Smart People. is a 14 song greatest hits package featuring one of the coolest underground bands of the 1990s scene.



This is true mid-fi pop-punk: a quality recording of a good band playing great songs, albeit with a hard pounding rip and a certain sonic looseness that feels raw and exciting in the same way that a terrific live show feels raw and exciting. I already went off on the CD in the last catalog, let me just say that I'm really happy with the way this one turned out and I fully expect that pop-punk fans are gonna be gobbling this album up like candy for the next five years... Yaaay, EGGHEAD. If you like THE KUNG FU MONKEYS or JUNIOR VARSITY, grab now! Ten bucks and fab!!!

The next installment of the MP singles series will come plopping out of the pipeline any day. The heroes of the hour are THE BEAUTYS, an Indiana trio that combines poppy hooks with garagey punk gonads. Lemme look that up, do girls have gonads? Yep, girls have gonads. Chica Baby definitely has gonads. Those of you who have snarfed down on copies of their wonderful self-released CD. Liquor Pig, already know how fabulous these hep-cats are and will doubtlessly be on the

train without further ado. Those of you who have somehow missed this band (ya dorks!) are in for a real treat! Three songs here, recorded especially for this record, and they're all butt-kickers featuring the sultry purr of the inimitable Chica—who used to be in THE SMEARS. The title track, "A#1 Sex Shop Employee" is a gritty little love song about a porn shop girl trying to pick up a porn shop boy. Then there's "DTs," a touching little melody about developing the whiskey shakes. The third tune is actually the big hit to me, "Cover Band," this punk band's sympathetic lament of the dashed dreams and bleak realities faced by rawk bands in the bar scene. It's a very, very fine tune! This one is gonna be on red-orange vinyl for the first 500 copies and it should be ready to ship towards the end of December. THE BEAUTYS rock hard, they've got poppy chops, punk energy gooshes from every pore. It's a record that should appeal to a lot of different folks, ranging from the ga-



rage set to the '77 patriots to the pop kids. MP-39 THE BEAUTYS "A#1 Sex Shop Employee" EP is three bucks, grab a copy for your stash and another for a friend!

Hey, somebody tell THE EYELINERS that I wanna do a record... Them and THE GROOVIE GHOULIES...

Damn, I've got three more to tell you about and the bottom of the page is rushing up on me like the ground on a skydiver. Get ready for page two. That reminds me of the most frightening thing I ever saw on television. One time about six or eight years ago, CNN showed this tape shot by a guy who used to jump out of planes with rookie skydivers and shoot video of them so they'd have something to take home to mama as a souvenir. Anyway, this guy jumped with a couple people and for fifteen seconds it's all doodley doodley, whee, we're having fun. Then the two people pulled their chutes... and the photographer figured out that he had left his own chute on the airplane! The camera jerked this way and that, frantically, helplessly, and the ground got closer and closer and closer and closer until the tape came to an abrupt end with damage lines mutilating the image. We used to watch Newzak at work all day, they only showed that video one time and I tell ya, it was pretty scarey shit. No skydiving for me, thank you very much.

So flip the page and let's talk about the Short-Runs...

Thanks ever so much to those of you who stepped up to the plate and dropped 45 bills on the first subscription to the Mutant Pop Short-Run CD series. I was hoping for 20 people to pony up for the pig in the poke and wound up with over 40, including a number of people who are not notorious MP record snorkers. Pretty amazing... Thank you! A thousand blank discs wound up costing \$1445—you guys footed that bill with enough change left over to pay for the first three sleeves.

> Obviously there are a shitload of other costs associated with the project, but this math should give you some idea of how it is gonna be possible for a very small core of music fans to make this series fly.

Before I get into the specifics of the first three projects out the gate and open them up for general sale, let me show you what the CD-R discs look like... The idea is to combine a certain degree of professionalism and quality with a little bit of a punk rock roughhewn feel. And no fucking stickers. I hate those! The discs are silk-screened with purple ink, then I get busy with a black Sharpie for the title, catalog number, and a red pen for the disc serial number. It's not totally glossy but it doesn't look like total shit either—sorta fitting for the kind of sound pop-punk bands make, now that I think about it. After I run through the first 1000 discs, I'll change the color of the ink from purple to forest green or something. The discs come packed in a Univenture Viewpak[™], a vinyl flip with a piece of anti-scuff felt next to the disc and a pocket to hold the booklet. These flips actually cost more than jewelboxes, believe it or not, but they have a completely different ambience—they "feel" like a 7" single, that's all I can say. The booklets will be of a standard design with a text block on the reverse and a band photo and lyrics, again attempting to replicate the "feel" of the Mutant Pop 7" vinyl series. We'll see

how people react when they have the actual discs in their paws, but I can say with perfect certainty that I'm truly happy with the way these things have turned out. Whether others share my enthusiasm, only time will tell...

The series will launch with three releases. In general, these things are going to come in multiples of three because the sleeves are run in gangs of three to a sheet. Although I should be like a good parent and pretend to love all Mutant Pop








projects equally, I can't help but get really, really excited about these three particular projects. Those of you who have been following the label for any length of time know my taste by now, and I tell ya, these three are right down Main Street of Mutant Popland.

MP-1004 THE PROTEENS Professional Teenagers EP was initially slated to be a four song vinyl 7". This Pennsylvania band was formerly known as THE TURDZ before a personnel change created an ideal opportunity to cut loose the ballast of their sub-rotten band name. Unfortunately, there was yet another personnel change (4 members became 2 members and then added a third) after the project was born and it began to be unclear whether this record would see the light of day. The new format made the decision an easy one though. Then when I was loading in the DAT into my computer, I noticed that there were actually seven songs from the session (produced by Cliffy Huntington, by the way). What was a very good vinyl 7" became a fabulous CDEP. It's half of a good album, plain and simple. Speaking of albums, the band will be doing their thing on Imperfekt Records from Maryland, so keep your eyes open for that. The band was nice enough to provide a stack of vinyl stickers, too, so everyone who picks up the Short-Run will get a sticker. THE PROTEENS tend to take an uptempo approach with excellent songwriting, good guitar grit, and sing-along vocals. Their songs are short and to the point in the best punk rock tradition, with six of their seven tunes clocking in under 2:12.

It's a safe bet that THE PROTEENS are gonna be around for some time to come as an important emerging band in the pop-punk underground, along with such luminaries of tomorrow as THE WALLYS, THE KLOPECS, and JUVENILE WRECK. They've got all the tools—that seemingly natural knack for songwriting, solid musicianship, a laid back attitude, and, most importantly, they have their shit together. Four bucks for the disc, the green light is on for orders.

Honestly, the first three Short-Runs out the door are really the three bandidos—these bands could make split EPs with one another and everyone would clap. They don't sound the same, but they do all come from the same branch of the



tree: three chord pop-punk via Weasel from The Ramones. I love all three of these releases truly. Indeed, THE PEABODYS will be recording for a vinyl EP as part of the Mutant Pop singles series in December. If you buy just one Short-Run CD to check out the new format, please pick up MP-1005 THE PEABODYS Are Chick Repellent. Fucking A, that's a great disc! Vocalist Eric Peabody has a distinctive, high voice—always a good thing, particularly when the subject matter is failed relationships and unhappy romances. The CD kicks off with a roar, the very cool "I Sing About Girls," which really sums it up for THE PEABODYS and many of their peers with a few classic lines: "I sing about, I sing about girls / I think about, I think about girls / I don't know what it is about them / Maybe because they drive me so insane / Don't care about politics or stupid guitar licks / Forget that shit, man, it's so boring." That's where they're at, too, loud, rocking love songs and hate songs for maladjusted, infatuated shy guys. Now here's the good part: BIG, BIG, BIG hits!!! You get two of them here, "Waste" and "Hopeless"—the latter of which is gonna be covered by THE WALLYS in the near future, I understand. All six songs are winners, but these two are

the sort of top quality pop hits that bands can chase for five years without ever getting close. I'm not shitting you, you need to buy this one. Four bucks. Mark it on your order form right now!!!

Then we have MP-1007 THE DARYLS Who Killed Bambi? It was gonna be titled "Franks, Beans, and Beer" or something like that, then they turned in a photo dressed in camo shirts and baggy shorts and I'm too much of a SEX PISTOLS fan to let that go to waste. Thanks for letting me use my stupid title instead of yours, guys... This one is almost archival in nature, a recording from the halcyon days of 1996. The band is from Washington state, they made the recording when they were living briefly in California. Now they're in Seattle, toiling in obscurity in one of THE worst live music scenes in the nation... How a band this good could go unnoticed for so long is a major mystery. If the mantra of THE PEABODYS is "I Sing About Girls," THE DARYLS have a theme song of their own: "Let's Have Fun." Energetic, three chord pop-punk that'll have you grinning from ear to ear during the first blast of short punk rock songs, the CDEP shifts gears with a long soft/loud/soft/loud song about a stepmother before finishing with a raucous version of "Chewy Chewy," joining THE AUTOMATICS on the short list of punk bands that have covered that classic gem. It's a cool mid-fi recording and the band is said to have a massive arsenal of newer tunes. We can only hope they get into a good studio and get them recorded soon—people who hear this Short-Run are gonna be waiting for that with baited breath. Yep, you need this one, too. And you know the price by now.............. four bucks!

I'm also gonna try to get the second group of three out the door by the first of the year—we'll see how that goes. I'll let you know more about those discs in the next catalog. If you want to subscribe for the first 12 titles out the door, you're still welcome to do that—although the discs may not all have the same serial numbers. Once things start shipping and individual orders roll in, the numbers are gonna get all out of whack... If you're totally quick with your sub, you may still get lucky... The subscription for the first 12 titles out the door costs \$45.

A little space left, I'll note that Josh Rutledge just finished an interview with me for *Hit List* magazine. That should run in issue #6, I think. *Hit List* is the official magazine of old white guys with bad attitudes and I definitely did my part to uphold that sacred traditions. It's safe to say I'm definitely off of Lookout's Christmas list and burned more bridges with record distributors than NATO in Serbia. It's only the truth that hurts, you fucking slimeballs... I even sent *Hit List* a picture of my dog, we'll see if they're cool enough to run that.

Hit List Supremo Jeff Bale asked me to write for his mag earlier and I turned him down, very nervous of the publication's political line. Bale got the heave-ho from MRR for going conservative. But hey, some of my best friends are conservatives and Bale's a libbie and not a fundie or a nazi—I'm definitely more at ease with Hit List's politics these days and will be trying my hand at a column starting in issue #7. I initially pitched the idea of doing a column on labels and distribution but Bale said not to necessarily limit myself to that, so we'll see where it goes...

Hmmm, what else? I've been really busy lately and haven't had a couple good, solid days off in a row to get this catalog finished. Having to burn like 300 CD-Rs for the Short-Run series one at a time off my computer because the blankety blanking russinfruckers at La Cie and APS can't ship the 6-up replicator didn't help matters. I reckon that it demonstrates that you don't necessarily need to drop \$2500 on the gear to crank the babies out, but it will be nice to get my life back when they finally get off their duffs and ship the unit. Well, I've blathered enough. Thanks again for your support, I do appreciate it!

Blah Blah Blah Blah...

I'm sitting here in Boise, Idaho for the holiday, hammering this thing out on a purple iMac. Yesterday was Thanksgiving. I drank way too much of my brother-in-law's good whiskey and had a nice long chat with a few aunts and uncles from my wife's side that I didn't know. Born in the early 1920s, these were prime examples of the World War II generation, and it was very interesting hearing about their lives during that conflict-an event that shaped their entire generation. The two old boys were swapping battle stories, one was in Italy from 1943 and the other in the Pacific from 1941. He said he had Sunday dinner on the Arizona exactly one week before it was sunk. Then I asked a really good question of the old girl and got her to tell the story of what she did during the war. It turns out she moved from Payette, Idaho to Portland, went to class for two weeks and was taught to be a welder, and spent the war years building warships. She was a poor kid during the depression who wound up making the princely sum of two bucks-ten an hour working long days laying down beads on double-hulled ships. About half the people who worked in the shipyards were female, she reckons, and the men were almost all unfit for service for physical reasons or age. Funny how that sort of service to the cause isn't even thought about by the public. I'd like to check out the historical literature about industry on the WWII home front...

Thanks are due to all of you who stepped up to the plate and ordered stuff from the last catalog. I had a walrus-sized pile of really nasty bills coming due at the same time and it was getting a little scary. I hoped to get 20 people to drop some coin on subscriptions to the short-run series and wound up with twice that many—enough chips to cancel out a couple gnarly bills. The stuff that other people bought helped me to keep current with my Mordam Records bill and to get Sonic Iguana paid off for the 4th **CONNIE DUNGS** album... It sounds trite and stupid and phoney, but it's honestly true: this choochoo runs on your cash; I just get to wear the engineer's hat and to toot the whistle once in a while. Thanks.

THE AUTOMATICS and I will be going out separate ways after the forthcoming Round Up CD. The band is ready to record a follow-up to their wonderful Go Bananas! album and I had to made a big decision—whether to pay for that recording and to put that out, or to concentrate on getting other groups' material recorded and on the street. I figured, quite rightly as it turned out, that a band of the Autos' stature didn't really need me to get their recording made and their stuff released. That album was gonna happen with me or without me—but putting the same chips elsewhere may well have made the difference between a truly great album happening or not happening. So really, assuming that the deal is all about getting a maximum number of good poppy punk albums into the world—what's the point?

The next AUTOMATICS album will be on Just Add Water Records. I think that's really good match, Jason Add Water (tee hee) is a pal, and all is right with the world. When that album's done, you can rest assured that I'll have it in mass quantities. I emphasize that the move from MP to JAW came at my prodding, it wasn't about sales figures or royalties or not getting the right color of M&Ms in the deli trays for a recent world tour...

Having thus freed up chips, the recordings that have been happening include a full-length by **RUTH'S HAT** and **THE WANNA-BES**. Ruth's Hat has checked into Sonic Iguana for

their album. The band is paying for a good chunk of the recording bill in exchange for a big heap of copies, which definitely helped to make it happen. You can rest assured that the result will be the band's best possible album. Say what you like about Sonic, that the studio is expensive or slow or apt to put too much gloss on a recording given infinite time—Mass and Co. really are masters of coaxing out the very best performances of a band, making sure everything is in-tune, in-key, and perfectly recorded and mixed. They are also the rulers of the universe in the science and art of creating a massive guitar roar. Classic pop-punk being the clash between sweet vocals and bitter guitar blast, Ruth's Hat's album is gonna be amazing!

THE WANNA-BES have stayed home in Seattle to record, visiting Conrad Uno and his Egg Studios (FASTBACKS, PRESIDENTS OF THE UNITED STATES). Another great album is in the offing, I'm sure—I'm really looking forward to hearing what that band can do in a top-notch studio. The band's ability to write first-division poppy punk hits was never in doubt.

On the singles front, I'm gonna get serious about getting the already recorded, mastered, plated, and test-pressed EPs by **THE CRETINS** and **THE CATALOGS** out the door in the next couple months. I put those on the back-burner when I couldn't score a useable cover shot from either band and it's time to either roll forward with a weak cover shot or to just run up the white flag and make a "stock" MP sleeve with a viewhole so you can see the label and put 'em into the world without a picture sleeve. Both records are really good, that's the bummer about the whole deal. But no band photos exist for sleeve, whatcha gonna do?

THE CONNIE DUNGS' "Turntable" 7" is also still in the works, although I know how hard it is getting them to get sleeve art done, so I'm not exactly rushing that one out the door.

The next new band to record a Mutant Pop EP will be **THE PEABODYS** from Warren, PA. THE PEABODYS combine a SCREECHING WEASEL-like feel for big pop hooks with a certain skill and craftsmanship in the songwriting department that I feel certain will win the band a dedicated following among pop-punk afficionados. Their EP records in late November and will be MP-41 on your dial, with a release slated for early 2000. Their Short-Run CD will certainly be on the street before that.

New additions to the Short-Run CD project continue to rack up, including a totally hot live recording of a June 1999 **DARLINGTON** show that includes a couple new tunes and a couple RAMONES cover songs, and **BORIS THE SPRINKLER**'s live set from Cincinnati—a show that Nørb wrote about at some length in his column in *Hit List* magazine #5. A CONNIE DUNGS live CD is also anticipated for the series, although I still haven't heard the set from Columbus to compare with the quality of their Cincinnati show. We'll go with the best of those two recordings—but since the set lists were fairly similar for each, it doesn't make a lot of sense to release both at this time. I've been putting the digital editing software to some use for these projects and I can definitely say that it's helping to take things up half a notch or so...

As a final note, the **SICKO** CD is definitely on—what was initially conceived as a CDEP of the "Three Tea" EP with a live "bonus track" eventually became the fifth and final SICKO full-length, combining their demo tape, a wide array of 7" tracks, and their last show in one massive package. —*T. Chandler*

Top of the Pops! with Josh Rutledge

As autumn's breeze gives way to winter's chill, THE HISSYFITS warm my soul. A year ago, this dynamic NYC trio dropped a magnificent bomb of a debut single (the red vinyl version of "All Dolled Up" is my second-favorite Mutant Pop title of all-time!) The second Hissyfits single is another pure gem. "Wish You Were Here" (released on Sounds Of Subterrania, a German label), like its predecessor, is driven by hot melodies, exquisite songwriting, and divine layers of heavenly vocals. Princess, Suzi Blade, and P-Girl take the concept of layered harmonies to the most sublime extreme! Wow! "Broken Window," "California," and "Stardust" are all smash hits! This is what one calls a "Triple A-side single," as each tune is a truly magnificent work of melody and harmony! I'm such a fervent fan that I bought both the new single and the Wish CD—the vinyl for domestic pleasure and the CD for the mixed tape bliss of automotive travel! Wish compiles all three tracks from "All Dolled Up" along with the new single and one comp cut.

As a whole, this 7-song treasure is a miraculous display of near-perfection from a band that has entered the *elite* tier of underground pop. Hell, hearing the immaculate "In My Dreams" on compact disc has made me a true believer in the CD format! I'm not kidding! Like The Chubbies, Buck, Mr. T. Experience, Parasites, The Fastbacks, and The Muffs, this band can do no wrong! What can I say? The Hissyfits rule!

Just when I needed a power pop fix, a new PAT DULL AND HIS MEDIA WHORES single magically appeared in my mailbox. How's that for glorious timing? Having already produced one of the finest power pop full-lengths of this era earlier in the year, there was little the Media Whores could do for an encore. Gimme The Whores was a textbook display of power pop at its finest—a big rock sound, crunchy guitars, and tasty pop tunes. And "It's About Time," the new single, doesn't alter the formula too much. Even with the addition of horns (yes, I said horns!), the PDAHMW sonic attack remains satisfying and simple. The title cut rocks harder than any previous Media Whores number (this is the band's most obvious paean to Cheap Trick so far), as the monster riffs meet a delicious chorus. Yum! On the flip is an acoustic rendition of "Declaration," one of the band's finest songs. I'm not much for holidays, but the arrival of a Media Whores record (or any single on Break Up! Records, for that matter) is an event worth celebrating with glee!

Two red-hot, rising, exciting pop bands—THE TRAVOLTAS and TUULI—have teamed up to unleash one of the best split singles of the year! I'm generally not a fan of splits, but this one (an American Pop Project/Coldfront Records co-release) is a real thriller! The Travoltas charm me with a delightful blend of early Beach Boys-inspired bliss-pop and high-energy power pop. Coldfront recently re-issued the band's excellent Screaming Apple LP on the CD format, so American pop lovers may now taste the band's sugary sonic treats. Loud guitars, thick harmonies, and an unabashed affection for the bubblegum ethos makes this outfit from The Netherlands hard to dismiss. If you're not quite ready to drop the cash for the CD, this split will give you a tasty sample of the Travoltas experience! I will be talking *a lot* about Tuuli in the future. I recently heard an advance of their forthcoming CD EP, and I can only say that I was blown away! Wow! Tuuli falls somewhere between Buck and The Hissyfits on the sonic scale. The band's cut on this split lacks the crispy, crunchy guitar wallop of its newer material, the song is still just about perfect. It's a breezy, delicate display of placid pop excellence. Most of you will probably compare it to Cub, and that's fine. I sadly missed the boat on Cub, but I will not miss the boat on Tuuli! I am completely in love with this Canadian band, and I eagerly await the opportunity to gush in more detail!

Finally, I must take a few moments to celebrate a blessed and joyous time in all of our lives—the arrival of a new KUNG FU MONKEYS single! On the surface, the band's "Fuel-Injected, Sugar-Coated, Whiz-Bang Christmas Shutdown, Volume 1" single may appear to be little more than a holiday novelty. But fear not, dear friends! While the boys from New York City may bring seasonal tidings of comfort and joy to their loyal devotees, they do so in classic KFM manner—pouring on the sugar and soaking your soul in an ocean of melodic glee. Call it a Christmas record if you wish, but even a non-believer like myself can jump for joy at the thought of hearing two more doses of shameless, over-thetop, unadulterated candy pop! I'm especially fond of the Bside, "Santa, Please Bring Me A Surfboard," a bouncy, happy tune that will compel you to either violently puke or merrily prance! In a world that's afraid to smile, the Kung Fu Monkeys continue to push the envelope in search of all that's giddy and yummy! The 6th KFM single will easily outlive any seasonal status, as good pop songs never date! —Josh Rutledge


PAT DULL AND HIS MEDIA WHORES "It's About Time" 7" \$3



A brain-dead major label-affiliated distributor that couldn't sell snowcones in Vegas in August just returned a pile of one of the greatest power pop albums of the 1990s on me. Stupid bastards! Long out of print, the label is defunct, these 13 songs will rock your universe. Get it now or be very, very sad for a long timeunless the hairlip distributor is able to scour up another little box of unsold CDs. An amazing album, sorta mod in feel, halfway between PAT DULL AND HIS MEDIA WHORES and DIRT BIKE ANNIE. Very highly recommended!



No joke, the best punk rock magazine on the face of the earth is *Hit List*, published by ex-MRR mucky muck Jeff Bale along with Coldfront Records honcho Brett Mathews. I'm gonna take up not just one but two slots on my Picks Page to bring the new issue of this baby to your attention. One: Hit List knows punk rock, unlike




the grossly misnamed *Punk* Planet, for example. A variety of punk sounds are covered by the magazine, they're well versed in musical history and poppy punk definitely is appreciated and gets a fair shake. Two: Hit List features the best writers of any rock'n'roll magazine in America. The great Rev. Nørb (who writes about the Cinci "Mutant Fest" and The Connie Dungs at length as part of his tour diary in this issue), Jack Rabid of The Big Takeover, Al Quint of Suburban Voice, Larry Livermore (ex-Lookout! Records), and many more. It's a great read, plain and simple. Three: gobs of well-written record




JAWBREAKER

Live 4/30/96 CD \$10

The CD version of the JAWBREAKER live show that was released in microscopic quantities on LP as Allied Recordings #100. Great sound quality, a seminal 1990s band doing its thing in front of a home audience. The set includes hits like "Save Your Generation," "Ashtray Monument," and "Boxcar" in addition to some lesserknown tunes. Singer/songwriter Blake Schwartzenbach (JETS TO BRAZIL) continues to exert an enormous influence upon the pop-punk world.



Jeremy Cool's Hit List review nails it: "Slick sounding punkish power-pop featuring former members of BIG DRILL CAR and DOUGHBOYS. The songwriting here is excellent, and there are hooks for miles; this stuff could easily be on the radio. I'd tell you to go see them on the Warped Tour, but apparently they brok up two weeks into it, so unfortunately we'll never know how far they could've gone. Still, this album is necessary listening for poppunk fans." Quite good.

FIFI AND THE MACH III "Rollin' Love" IMPORT EP \$4

From Let's Dance Records of Torino, Italia comes this three song pop-punk smasheroonie from Japan's finest, FIFI AND THE MACH III. Buzzing guitars and a gritty, soulful frontwoman that belts 'em out in unaccented English. Mucho coolo, this would be on my Picks Page if I didn't hog so much space with the *Hit List* blurb. Very cool sheiss from a band on the other side of the Pacific, put out by a label on the other side of the Atlantic. **Check it.**

THE CHROMOSOMES "INST-DL" IMPORT EP \$4

It has been a long time between releases from this fab Italian pop-punk outfit. Their debut album was on SuperSonic RefridgeRecords from Genova. Four hot songs here, well crafted and mid-tempo and melodic with lots of cool harmonies. Not too far off of RUTH'S HAT country, truth be told. Great! One of my favorite European bands... Be advised: this vinyl was not pressed flat and one song may skip on your turntable. I got discs from two sources and they're all like that.



BEATNIK TERMITES split EP w/PARASITES \$3 Originally a release on Just Add Wate

Originally a release on Just Add Water in 1995, this record was reissued by Reggie from the BEATNIK TERMITES on his own Insubordination Records label. Revised grey sleeve and red vinyl, if you're a collector nerd you need both this and the original JAW pressing to fill out that TERMITES set. Two very short songs by seminal bands with roots in the early 1990s pop-punk scene—before the big wave of 1994-1996 hit. Good stuff but I wish the record was longer!

BELL

"Already There" 7" \$3

I'm just five hours down the road from Seattle, but I tell ya, I don't have a clue about what's going on there. All these great bands exist in one of the most crap live music environments in the country. This is BELL's 1997 debut 7". The name you need to know is Vanessa Veselka—a big dog, an axe-toting rock'n'roll warrior. BELL is not as sweet as THE CHUBBIES, not as gritty as THE BEAUTYS, and way catchier than TILT. Say hello to a first-line band!



PROBE!

"Microscopic" EP \$3

Judging from the way people responded with their orders, I think I scared people with my description last time. The people who got this record from me seem to have almost universally loved it... It's really cheesy new wave synthesizer-driven stuff, sure, but it's soooooo cool! It was my pick of the month for a reason, it's a great pop record! One song with boy vocals, one with a girl. Catchy as hell and very entertaining in a kitschy kinda way.



BELL

"Viral Love" 7" \$3

One good BELL record deserves another! This is the new seven-incher from the two girls and two boys from the upper left corner of the country... Vanessa: "You're not looking for a lover, you're looking for a host / I don't really love you but I like you the most." Classic! If BELL's 7" is cool and substantive and melodic, this one drunkenly kicks a gaping hole in the livingroom sheetrock. Absolutely terrific stuff, Vanessa visits Exene Cervenka-land. *This flat-out fucking rocks!*



THE KUNG FU MONKEYS "Shindig!" EP \$3

Since this is EGGHEAD Appreciation Month, here's a reminder that the new CD is actually the *second* time EGG-HEAD has been featured on a Mutant Pop Release. Yep, the Big Apple Corps was James Cahill's backing band on this first KUNG FU MONKEYS release! Super swell mid-fi punky, jangley pop hits—three in all. The A-side is classic, they celebrate carbon dioxide abuse on the flip, they cover HERMAN'S HERMITS. What more could you want?



ANTI-FLAG split EP w/ AGAINST ALL AUTHOR. \$3


I tried to get this record when it first came out and I couldn't get the label to actually send it. Better late than never—I finally managed to snatch a batch just as the platter was heading for outofprintsville. ANTI-FLAG play catchy, singalong, SEX PISTOLS-type, political punk. Not HC but they definitely have the spirit of 1982. AAA is a punk rock band with horns—calling them "ska-punk" and lumping them with the ska bozos in checks would be a great disservice. Six killer cuts!



THE SHITBIRDS split EP w/SIMON AND THE BAR SINISTERS \$3

Okay, many people don't like surf. I can deal with that. You need to check these bands out though, because they grind all those lame surf bands into a fine powder. SIMON AND THE BAR SINISTERS were edgey enough to write a song called "Surf 2000" back in 1993. Cool. THE SHITBIRDS flat out *rule!* Maximum Rocknroll would review this record. An unknown rocking slab from 1994 that was put out on the very hep SFTRI label.





ENEMY YOU

Where No One Knows My Name CD \$10

I wrote a mean blurb that involved David Jones and a 60 gallon vat of Cheeze-WhizTM, but I'll let it go... If AFTER SCHOOL SPECIAL = (SCREECHING WEASEL + BAD RELIGION), then ENEMY YOU = (BAD RELIGION + NOFX + BAD RELIGION). Fourteen uniformly uptempo, sterile, heavily produced blasts that drench David's ofttimes interesting lyrics. Big AFS fans will probably find something to like.



THE UNKNOWN

Still Unknown CD \$10 After several cool 7-inchers, THE

UNKNOWN is on the board with a fulllength. Production values have been taken up two notches here, the guitar roar is very clean and the vocals and harmonies are crisp. This recording took 'em time. Solid pop-punk with big hooks and immaculate production. My taste is going in a mid-fi direction, so this sounds too pretty and rawk for my ears. Nevertheless, this is a first division poppy punk band that knows how to write a good song and to record it.



SLACKER

A Day in the Life of... CD \$10

Hey! The only out-of-print Mutant Pop CD is back for a brief visit. I got a small batch of these back from the retards at Caroline Distribution, here's your chance to complete that MP CD set if you've got fast feet. Solid power pop from the WESTON camp, a little bit overproduced by the fine folks at Sonic Iguana. There are some real hits here, but it's a little too "rock" for my taste these days. Pressing of only 937 copies and that's all she wrote...



ANN BERETTA To All Our Fallen Heroes



Actually, that's no news flash...



BELL

A New Kind of Rome CD \$10


Not only are there two great BELL singles in this catalog, the band also has a brand new CD on the street for those analogimpaired folks out there. Only one of the four 7" songs are on the full-length, which means you need to run the table if you're gonna get on the BELL train with both feet. An excellent, powerful, poppy femalefronted band from Seattle. Package includes a little pseudo-US flag which you can burn or not. Very cool!

THE JIMMIES New 5 Song CDEP \$5

Like an airhead, I forgot to bring a copy of this one home to scan and I can't find mine... This is a self-released CDEP by Ben Weasel's newest signees, THE JIMMIES. (Ben is also putting out THE EYELINERS, by the way). THE JIMMIES are SW disciples, this contains two new tracks and three oldies dating back to the band's first recording session ever, 1989. Sounds like a Mutant Pop Short-Run, eh? Support these guys!



THE FUSES

I Wanna Burn CD \$10

Back in Stock. I vote that this is the best '77-Britpunk album of the 1990s. Anthemic songwriting. A big blast of sound, totally great songwriting, and just the right amount of production to make it cool without making it wanky. Twelve killer tunes from this band that began its life as pop-punkers WEBSTER. I'm trying really hard to place these guys next to somebody from the '77 Britpunk pantheon that would make sense. Not sure. Ultra hard pop music. Indispensible Britpunk.



THE SPILLS split CDEP w/ THE HEARTDROPS

All the underground labels are looking for a way around the collapse of the wholesale vinyl market. Seven-inch never was a money-maker for labels and now it's looking more and more like a financial disaster. Stiff Pole records is testing the six song split CDEP format. Hey, Stiff, Short-Run is the key to life! Both of these bands rock hard, THE SPILLS turn in a TOM PETTY cover powerful and tuneful punk-inflected rock'n'roll. Very solid!



THE RICHIES

Why Lie? Need a Beer! CD \$10

THE RICHIES are the fathers of the RAMONES-core movement. These Duisburgers were the first to make emulation of the basic RAMONES formula a specific sub-genre of poppy punk. THE RAMONES themselves may have sucked in their latter years, but bands like this which returned to the basic sound of the first four albums certainly did not. THE RICHIES proved that there was still vast acreages of territory which remained to be plowed in the field of three chord punk.



THE RICHIES

Pet Summer IMPORT CD \$10

Cool parody of a BEACH BOYS LP. THE RICHIES sound like THE RAMONES—not THE BEACH BOYS! Indeed, in the words of Ox fanzine, THE RICHES are "Die deutsche RAMONES-Epigonen-Legende." That sums it up nicely and I don't even read German. These guys are so RAMONES-core that they even grew their hair out! This album was made in 1993, way ahead of the curve. Three chord pop-punk for lovers of three chord pop-punk!



THE MORNING SHAKES "Piss Off Daddy!" 7" \$3

New York rock'n'rollers THE MORNING SHAKES are back with a blazing platter that'll have you greasing back your hair and strutting around the living room. THE SHAKES have got their first drop-dead classic under their belts. "Piss Off Daddy" is the kind of mind-numbingly catchy R&R tune that three dozen bands will eventually be covering as encores at live shows. You'll wear this record out-it's sensational! A rocking ZERO BOYS cover on the flip.

"Hello Nippon" EP \$3

I've only got a small handful of this nifty 7" compilation. Four Japanese poppy punk bands singing in English: NAVEL, MIDDISHADE, TAMI, and MOGA THE ¥5. Pretty much mid-tempo fare here, these bands exhibit the UK sound being put out on Crackle! Records. A small press edition DIY package featuring handwriting on construction paper with tha little sticker for a sleeve and a plain white label. A worthwhile obscurity for your stash.



ANTI-DOMESTIX "This Demon Called Love" EP \$3

Another fine platter from Cheetah's Records. I was expecting this four song EP to be hard and grating—instead it's mid-speed, hooky, and even has some "whoa-whoa" backing vocals. Too much edge to the guitars and the production to be in the SoCal camp. It's much closer to AFI or SCREW 32, which is not a sound that I'm well versed in. The band is from Stockton and they'll be on Lookout! Records eventually, I'm sure. Tee hee. DIRT BIKE ANNIE



THE ZILLIONAIRES self-titled EP \$3

Hey, here's a first: THE ZILLIONAIRES have got an anti-pop girl song on here ("She Went Pop"). That would definitely be a concern for these guys, 'cuz this certainly ain't pop-punk. It's melodic enough and it's totally mid-tempo, mind you, but this straight-on punk rock has a loud, jagged, amateurish edge to the guitars and vocals that sound like an American SHAM 69 or something. Music for people who need a little abrasiveness a la THE CANDYSNATCHERS.



"Sitcoms and Summer Camps" EP \$3

I managed to score one last little batch of this third DIRT BIKE ANNIE seven-inch before the disc slides out of print. If you've been putting off buying this little gem for some bizarre reason, the time has come to dig into that wallet. Four nonalbum power-pop smashes featuring raw and real mid-fi production. Killer performances with style and flourish. DBA is one of the best bands on the planet and they're happening, hot stuff!



THE REAL KIDS "Down to You" 7" \$3

This is an interesting one: a brand new single by some golden oldie power poppers, THE REAL KIDS. Point of reference on this disc is THE UNDER-TONES—but definitely with less vocal abrasion than that delivered by the nearlyalways-annoying Feargal Sharkey. Excellent toe tapping rock'n'roll songs with bit of a punky edge. There's even info about a REAL KIDS fanclub inside the record, whith shirts and buttons and four full-lengths for sale. Nifty, I reckon.



THE SONIC DOLLS "Electric Man" IMP. EP \$4

Yippee! I just received another allotment of this wonderful three song rocker by German three chord pop-punkers THE SONIC DOLLS. People in the US first got turned on to this band when they made their split with BORIS THE SPRINKLER. This four songer features winks to THE RAMONES ("You Can't Go Back to East Berlin") and THE QUEERS ("Kicked Out of The Sonic Dolls"). An Italian import on Let's Dance Records and you should get this into your collection if you still need it.



SUBURBAN VOICE #43 big fanzine w/free CD \$4 with 5 item purchase.

This long-running zine remains one of the best punk rock mags in the country. Al Quint is a columnist for Hit List and he's been doing this labor of love since the days before personal computers. Al's a 1982 guy-politically charged, spikey hair straight on punk rock and hardcore is his interest. I'm reviewing a few poppunk records for the mag. This comes with a free 20 song CD featuring ANTI-FLAG, UNSEEN, PIST, and tons more.
